GCSE Gold Standard Upgrade for St Clement's High School

The staff and students at St Clement's High School have this week been celebrating a further improvement in their GCSE results. Following the publication of the results in the summer the school requested that a number of GCSE English exam papers were remarked. This week the results were received and a number of students had their grades improved. The performance of secondary schools is measured by the percentage of students who receive five or more GCSE's grades A* to C including English and Maths, this measure is known in schools as the Gold Standard. St Clement's recent upgrade in results means 60% of students achieved the Gold Standard.
